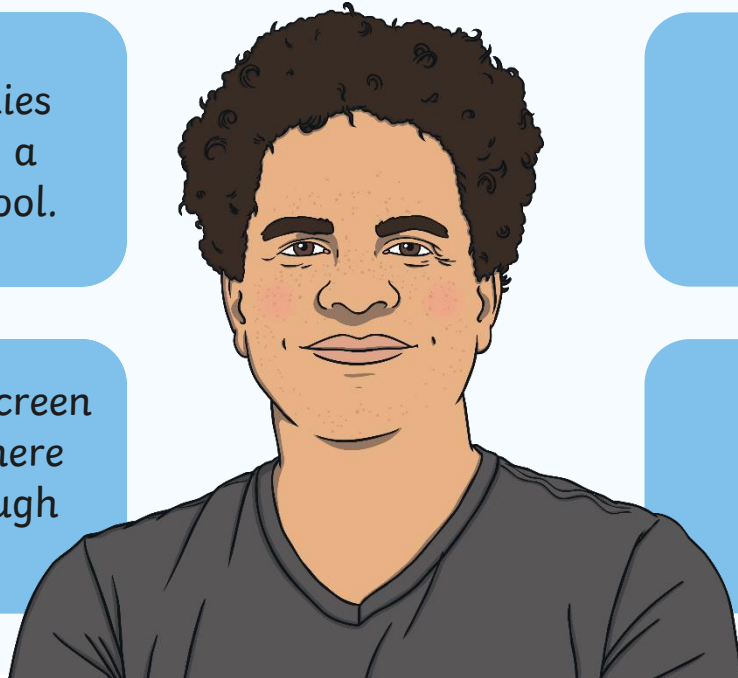


Who Is Romero Britto?

A person who creates sculptures. They may do this by carving or moulding a material, such as wood or metal.

A person who applies paint either using a brush or another tool.

A person who does screen printing. This is where ink is pressed through a stencil.



Romero Britto is a Brazilian artist.

He is a pop artist.

He is a painter, serigrapher and sculptor.

How Did Romero Britto Become an Artist?

Romero loved art from an early age.

He taught himself and would paint at any given opportunity.

He would use his imagination to paint on surfaces, such as newspaper and cardboard.

What Is Pop Art?

Pop art first came to Britain in the mid 1950s.

It is classed as modern art.

It is based around popular culture, including advertising and comic books.

It uses bright colours and bold patterns.

What Is Cubism?

Cubism first became popular in the early 1950s.

It was brought about by an artist called Pablo Picasso.

Pictures were separated into geometric shapes.

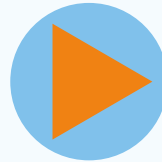

Examples of His Work

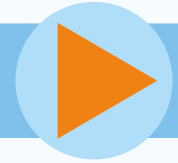
Romero Britto has created work for many popular brands.

His work is also displayed in many popular places, such as airports.

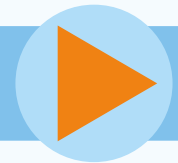


The Royal Family

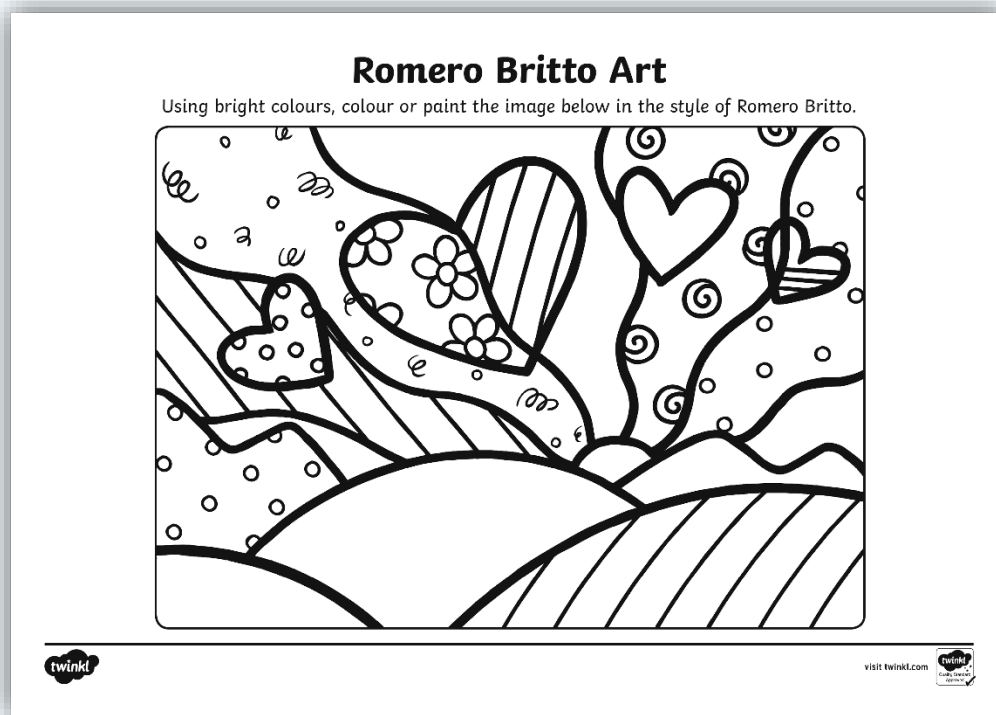
